Our new exhibition in Oslo's Old Town Hall/Theatre Museum is a presentation of the old town of Christiania (Oslo). Oslo burnt down in 1624 and the Danish-Norwegian King Christian IV relocated the town and renamed it after himself. The exhibition shows models of buildings and portraits from the period. It also casts a light on urban development, change in building traditions and living conditions.
